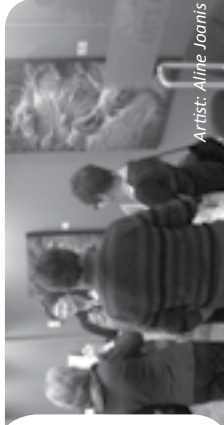


# COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

SELECTIONS

60 artists

Over 320 submissions were received, which resulted in a total of 60 artists showing 51 works in the Trinity Art Gallery from September 26 to October 22. The jury awarded "Best in Show" merits to Samuel Jan for his piece entitled *The Spell*, Linda Fredette for her piece entitled *Spinal Blur*, and Diana Kline for her piece entitled *Surfacing*, while members of the public voted for Ron Matton as the recipient of People's Choice award.

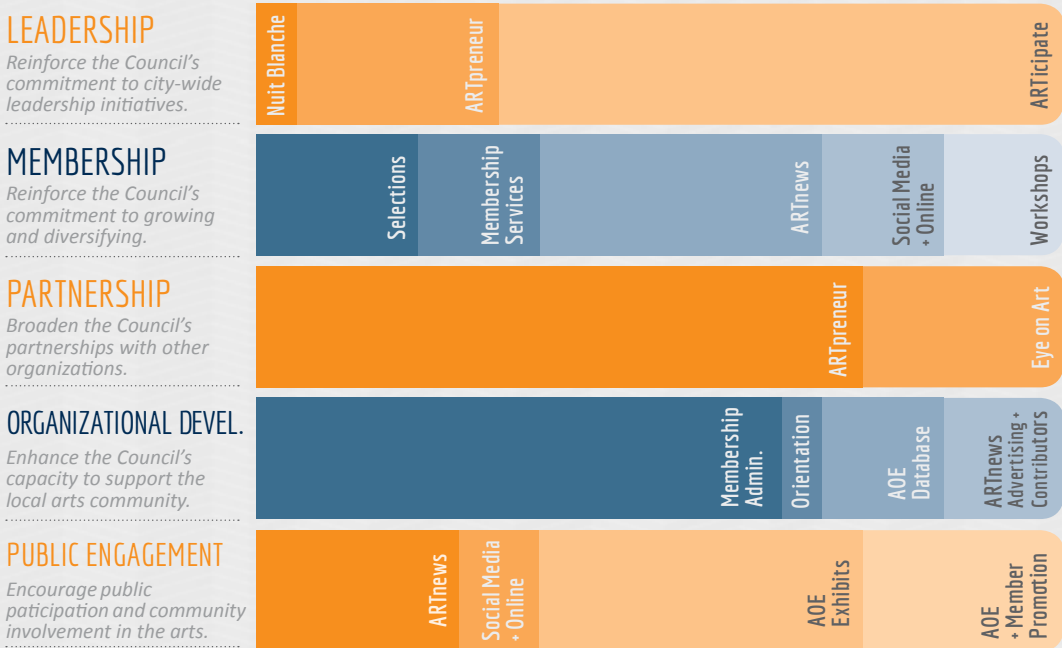

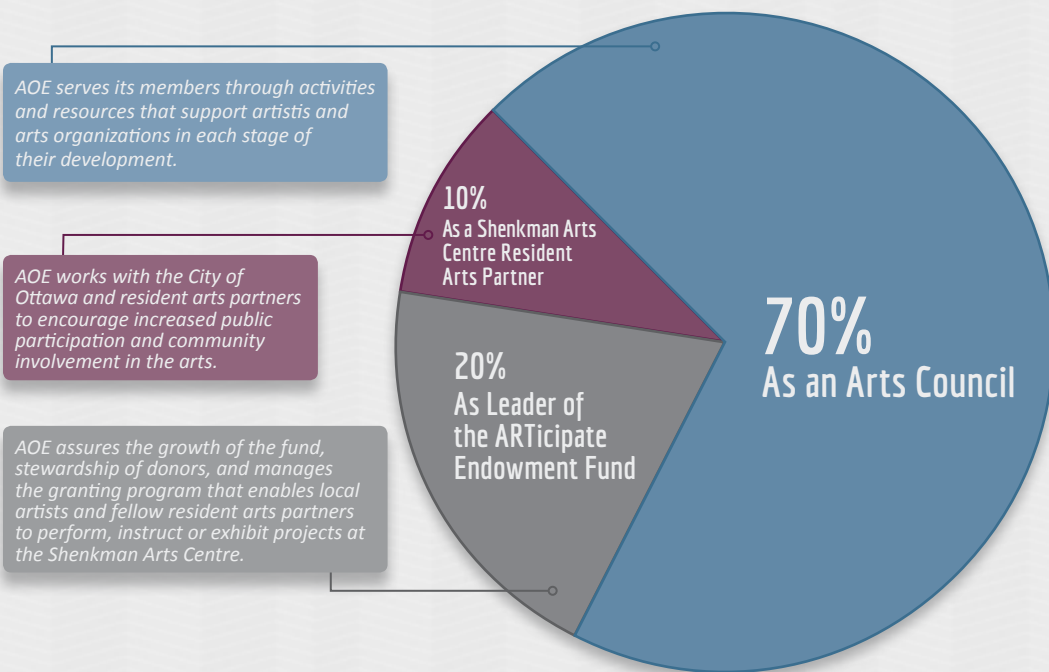


## STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS

\* Percentage dedicated to activities and operations for each strategic direction



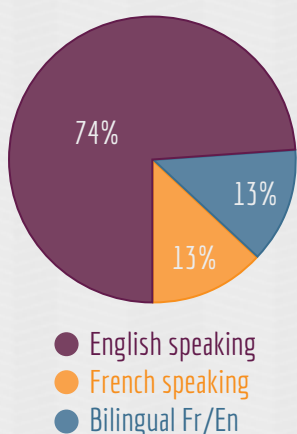
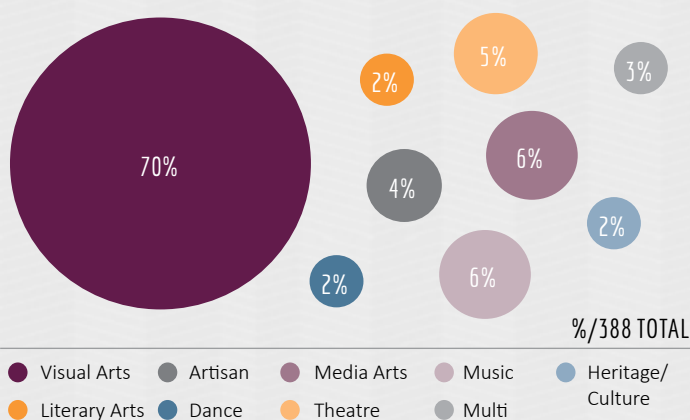
